

## Privacy Notice

### Your Personal Data – Executors, Powers of Attorney and Other Associated Persons

This notice is intended for people whose data we collect in relation to an account, but who are not the account holder. For example: executors, powers of attorney or others acting on behalf of a customer, or providing a collateral charge etc.

If you fit into one of the categories described above, Bath Building Society will hold certain personal data about you. How we deal with this data is governed by the UK General Data Protection Regulations (or UK GDPR for short) and this document is intended to give you a brief overview.

#### **Our responsibility**

Bath Building Society will be the data controller for your personal data relating to the accounts you are associated with.

As your data controller:

- ✓ We only collect data that is necessary
- ✓ We store it safely and securely
- ✓ We do not hold it for longer than is necessary.

#### **How we use your personal data**

Your personal data will only be used in relation to your responsibilities on the administration of the relevant account(s).

We do not sell your personal data. As part of administering your account(s), we may occasionally share some of it with other organisations, some examples of this are to:

- make sure it's really you when you apply for products and services
- manage your accounts and allow you to use our services, such as our Mobile App
- stop financial crime such as fraud (where someone might be pretending to be you)
- provide products and services from other organisations, such as our payment partners

Other organisations may operate both in and out of the United Kingdom (UK). In cases where we do share your data outside the UK, we will ensure that data protection is to a suitable standard.

We will also share your information for financial crime prevention purposes and where required to by law.

#### **Reasons for processing your personal data**

The UK GDPR says that firms can only use personal data where there is a fair reason to do so. Some of the acceptable reasons it states are when:

- the processing is necessary to do with your account
- we have a legal duty to process the data
- we have a legitimate interest in processing the data
- we have your specific consent

We may ask for your marketing preferences. If we do, you can change them at any time. We will still send you information when we are obligated to do so.

### Your rights relating to your personal data

The UK GDPR gives you the below rights relating to your personal data. This is intended as a brief summary, for more detail you can view our full privacy notice:

<b>Right to be informed</b>	You can ask about how we collect and use your data, and how long we keep it for
<b>Right of access</b>	You can ask for a copy of your data, commonly referred to as a Subject Access Request (SAR)
<b>Right to rectification</b>	You can ask us to correct any errors with your data
<b>Right to erasure</b>	You can request that we delete your data
<b>Right to restrict processing</b>	You can ask us to limit how we use your data
<b>Right to data portability</b>	You can ask us to transfer your data
<b>Right to object</b>	You can ask us to stop processing your data, although in some cases we may continue to do so
<b>Rights related to automated decision-making, including profiling</b>	You have some protections against automated decision making and profiling. You can request information about the processing that takes place, and ask for human intervention or challenge a decision.
